



A LITTLE LAND CAN GO A LONG WAY.

In India, on homestead plots as small as 2,000 to 3,000 square feet (less than one tenth of an acre), formerly landless families are producing all of their annual vegetable needs, nearly all their fruit

needs, and most of their dairy needs, plus earning \$160 to \$220 a year from surplus production—an amount about equal to the annual wages of a landless agricultural worker.
